Dr Newman served as honorary International Deputy Director (Caribbean) in the movement since 2007. He will succeed Dr Lindsay Brown in leading the global team of 12 Lausanne Regional Directors.

Dr Newman, from Jamaica, served until recently as President of the Caribbean Graduate School of Theology. He brings a long involvement in Global Mission and Theological Education and is a senior member of the International Mission Network (INFEMIT). He gained his PhD through the Oxford Centre for Mission Studies (OCMS) and served as a member of the OCMS Council of Trustees. He served on the staff of the International Fellowship of Evangelical Students (IFES) for over 30 years. On the work of Lausanne, Las has commented that, 'John Stott and Billy Graham brought a unique contribution to the global church in the twentieth century and the Lausanne Movement, founded in Lausanne, Switzerland in 1974, has continued their outstanding work, under God'.
